Minutes of Board Meetings

1801

On October 23rd 1801 a group of men met in Dublin's Royal Exchange Buildings to discuss a plan to open a fever hospital on the south side of the city. Among the attendance was Arthur Guinness the founder of the brewing business. Though this was the only meeting he attended (he died in 1803) his son also called Arthur joined the founding committee shortly afterwards. Guinness family involvement continued at board level up to 1861 with the retirement of Benjamin Lee Guinness.

As no adequate Hospital accommodation has hitherto been provided for the relief of the sick poor of Dublin afflicted with ~~contagious diseases~~^{poor} especially such as may be of contagious nature and as it has been found by experience that every exertion heretofore made for the relief of persons labouring under the above disorders at their own houses has in a great measure failed in producing the wished for effect. The establishment of a House of Recovery to which patients on the first appearance of disease might be removed has therefore been long considered as an Institution much wanting and peculiarly calculated to alleviate the complicated miseries suffered by the poor from the prevalence of contagious Disease, and it having been intimated by Government that they were disposed to assist such an undertaking, A Subscription was immediately entered into, a proposal containing the outlines of such plan as was most likely to meet with general approbation, and a Statement of the aid that might be required signed by 4 of the Subscribers laid before Government and the sum of £1375:2:6. having been subscribed, the Subscribers were summoned to meet on 28th October 1804 at the Royal Exchange when the following persons attended -

Newton James and his co-subscribers convinced
by long experience of the complicated misery suffered
by the poorer classes of the people in this City, from the
prevailence of contagious Fever, and the necessity of
applying an effectual remedy thereto, propose, with the
assistance of others to erect and undertake the managmt
and superintendance of a House of Recovery in that part
of the City of Dublin called the Liberty for the reception
of Patients of the poorest class labouring under contagious
Fever, and resident within such District as shall be
agreed on by the managing Committee to be annexed to,

We consider it as a fundamental principle of such
an Establishment that manifest poverty and disease
properly ascertained by the Visitors or Physicians of
the Institution should be the only circumstances
necessary to entitle a Patient to admission and that
no recommendation of a Subscriber should on any
account be afforded to unless the above circumstances
shall upon minute inquiry at the Houses of the person
recommended be found to concur.

In order to carry the above design fully into effect,
we are of opinion, that the Erection of a new Building
adapted to its construction and all its arrangements for
the specific purpose of a House of Recovery is highly
desirable and we have already collected from some
Individuals impressed with the same conviction the
sum of £802¹³ 7¹² independent of Annual Subscriptions,
and of £200 bequeathed by the Will of the late Wm Wright
Pike deceased. And we engage to expend in the
procuring a suitable situation, the Erection of a Building
for the above purpose capable of holding 100 beds, and
the

the necessary Furniture & a sum not less than £1500 provided that Government should think proper to encourage the undertaking by the Grant of £500 towards the outfit, and also by an annual Grant of £500 in aid of subscription, towards the support of the Institution, said annual Grant to be continued so long only as Government are convinced of the utility of the Establishment and satisfied with the manner in which it shall be conducted,

And it being a desirable object that such an Institution should be free from the burden of a large annual rent, it may be judged advisable to purchase or fine down the Ground Rent of the premises on which the Building is proposed to be erected, or if it shall be judged expedient to provide accommodation for an additional Number of Patients ^{beyond} than what is above specified and a further expense of £1000 may be thereby incurred, we beg leave to suggest that in the event of such expenditure the object in view would be promoted if Government should think proper to grant an addl sum of £300 in aid of such further expenditure.

In order to afford to Government an opportunity of ascertaining that any sums of public Money that may from time to time be granted are faithfully applied towards the purposes above stated, we propose that three persons approved of by them shall be nominated with twelve other Trustees who shall have the property of the Institution under their control and the said Trustees with 15 other persons chosen by the Subscribers to the Institution to be the Committee in the general

Dublin Castle 31. Oct. 1801

Sir,

I have laid before the Lord Lieutenant the Memorial delivered by you of certain persons proposing to establish a House of Recovery for the Sick Poor of the Metropolis residing in the liberty and praying the Aid of Government to carry the same into Execution.

His Excellency highly approving of such an Establishment directs me to acquaint you, that when it shall appear that the sum of One Thousand Pounds is subscribed and

and applied in the manner proposed by the Society,
that their Excellency will recommend that an
Application shall be made to Parliament for a
Grant of One Thousand Pounds towards defraying
the expences of erecting the Building and of the first
Charges thereof, and will further recommend, that
the sum of Five Hundred pounds shall annually
be continued to it, so long as Government shall
be convinced of the Utility of the Institution
and satisfied with the Manner of its being
conducted.

The establishment of Houses of Recovery or Fever Hospitals has long found by experience to be the only effectual method for checking the progress of Contagion among the poorer classes and has been attended with a degree of success beyond expectation in Manchester Waterford and other populous Towns

The Institution embraces two objects, 1 The immediate removal of the infested person from his own Dwelling place - 2 The adoption of measures for counteracting the progress of Infection in the Habitations of the poor

The want of such an Establishment has been much more
sorely felt than in the City of Dublin, particularly in that quarter which
comprises the Liberty and its immediate neighbourhood, where every
circumstance that could aggravate or spread contagion has been combined
and where the ravages of Famine with all its attendant calamities has hitherto
baffled every exertion made to repel them, His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant
having expressed his approbation of such an establishment and his intention
to recommend that an application be made to Parliament for Grant
towards the erection and support thereof a subscription has been opened
for the purpose of Erecting a Building adapted for the specific purpose of a
House of Recovery and for defraying together with such aid as may be
afforded by Parliament the annual Expenses of the Institution,

The extent of the design will vary according to the
degree of support it may receive from the public - The relief of the
destitute poor and the Improvement of their Condition being the
main purposes of the Institution it is considered as a fundamental
principle that manifest poverty and disease should be the only
circumstances necessary to entitle a Patient to admission and that no
recommendation of a Subscriber should on any account be accepted
unless both these Circumstances shall upon minute inquiry at the houses
of the persons recommended be found to concur.

The Subscribers have nominated 15 Trustees in whom
the property of the Institution is to be vested and the
Trustees with six other Persons annually to be elected by the




